AN UPDATE FROM ADELAIDE BRIGHTON CEMENT ON COVID-19

Adelaide Brighton Cement (ABC) has continued to operate through the COVID-19 restrictions, with a range of adjustments based on best advice from health authorities and the SA Government.

As an essential service provider to the construction and resources industries it is vital that we maintain operations, while implementing immediate actions around hygiene, social distancing and remote work, to ensure the health and safety of our teams and customers.

New protocols and procedures have minimised the risk of COVID-19 and will continue to protect our staff into the future. The health and safety of staff, contractors and the public remain our foremost priorities.

LENDING A HAND TO SEMAPHORE TENNIS

ABC is thrilled to have been able to assist the Semaphore Lawn Tennis Club, which has been in operation for more than 140 years, with the recent purchase of a portable defibrillator machine.

After a serious cardiac incident at the Largs Bay courts last year, the club decided it was vital that a defibrillator be installed in the clubroom – something it has now been able to do with the help of a donation from ABC.

Club members had been looking forward to returning to the court after the removal of COVID-19 restrictions and we're delighted they will be able to do so with this additional health and safety measure in place.





HELPING UNITINGCARE TAPEROO FEED THE COMMUNITY

At the start of last year, the Lefevre Uniting Church in Taperoo established a place to connect the community through an indoor/ outdoor coffee shop (coffee@63), an op shop, a library and a butterfly garden.

When COVID-19 struck, the coffee shop and these community activities had to close, however volunteers wanted to reach out to their community even more. So, when UnitingCare SA offered the opportunity to provide frozen meals to people struggling to put food on the table due to COVID-19, volunteers welcomed it and established UnitingCare Taperoo.

ABC has been at the forefront of support efforts by UnitingCare Taperoo, after providing a grant that enabled an Emergency Relief Centre to be established and initial meals to be supplied.

Since opening nine weeks ago, 790 meals have been distributed to 122 local residents. During the last four weeks an average of 130 meals were being distributed each week. Initially all meals were cooked by volunteers from the Lefevre and Port Adelaide Uniting Church in the coffee@63 kitchen. However, as the demand for meals increased, additional meals have been supplied by OzHarvest.

Every person collecting a meal has a story to share. Many have spoken of the way in which the care provided through the initiative has helped them in their time of need.

Jane* should be enjoying her retirement. Instead, she is battling cancer and her daughter's family has moved in after losing their jobs. A few frozen meals and a good chat with the volunteers have helped her to go away with a little more cheer in her heart.

Sophie* rings every week and talks to the volunteers for 20 minutes when ordering her preferred meals. Being unable to get food from the local supermarket or catch up with friends and relatives has really taken a toll. For her and others, having someone to talk to over the phone when ordering their meals is as important as the food itself.

Pete* came in to see, 'what all the fuss was about,' after talking for a bit, it turned out his family is experiencing financial stress as a result of being stood down by his employer. He's the only breadwinner in the family and it's hard to ask for help. But when several meals were offered, he was thrilled to take them home.

There have also been families like Steve's*: when they came in, they didn't even have any winter clothes for their kids. This is why it is great to have an op shop onsite - they got to pick out some warm things for the whole family.

FUGITIVE DUST REDUCTION PROJECT

ABC has installed a specialist geofabric commonly known as “sand tarps” to cover non-working surfaces on the relocated bauxite stockpile on the southern side of the Birkenhead plant; significantly reducing the risk of fugitive dust impacting the community.

The bauxite stockpile was relocated close to the material handling system in order to reduce vehicle movement and fugitive dust associated with that activity.

The tarps are well secured and the specialist geofabric results in a reduction of fugitive emissions from the stockpile surface by 95 per cent. Heavy duty sand tarps are commonly used in other industries such as the mining and grain industries to eliminate fugitive dust.

AN UPDATE ON OUR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT WORK

ABC manages an Environmental Improvement Plan (EIP), endorsed by the Environment Protection Authority (EPA), which addresses fugitive dust and noise issues identified in consultation with the Community Liaison Group and nearby community.

Gas train noise reduction

ABC has worked closely with APA, who manage the gas supply infrastructure, to reduce noise levels from the gas supply to the factory. Together we conducted a redesign, and subsequent installation of new equipment to regulate the gas pressure and flow rate.

Pleasingly, a significant reduction of 13 dBA at the source has now been achieved.





LOCAL MANUFACTURING CREATING OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH

Dion Samu joined the ABC team in February, having previously undertaken work experience while studying at Adelaide University.

Here is the story of his journey to ABC:

I grew up in Whyalla, 400km out of Adelaide, but made the move to the city to start my Bachelor of Engineering at the University of Adelaide. I eventually graduated with Honours in Chemical and Pharmaceutical Engineering at the end of 2019.

During my studies, my interest moved more and more towards minerals processing and I was lucky enough at the end of my third year of study to gain 12 weeks of work experience as an undergraduate chemical engineer with ABC. I worked on multiple engineering projects at the Birkenhead site under the supervision of senior process engineers, which was incredibly beneficial for my learning and professional development.

Having enjoyed the work so much, I pursued a position in the 2020 Adbri Limited graduate program and was fortunate to be awarded a position of graduate chemical engineer at Birkenhead. Since starting this role in February, I have been part of the process improvement team and have had great opportunities to work on engineering projects across multiple areas of our operation. I have gained invaluable exposure to the quality, production and environmental aspects of the business and hope to be ready to take on a new role at ABC at the completion of the graduate program in 2022. Long term, I hope that throughout my career with Adbri Limited I will be able to contribute to improving the sustainability of our production processes.
